This year, we congratulated See Her on graduating from the Midwest Montessori Training Center. Along with Pa Chia Her and Theresa Kallmes, I know our educators created a nurturing, enriching, and welcoming experience for every child who crossed our classroom's threshold this year!

Thank you also to our board of volunteers, who provide thoughtful stewardship of this small nonprofit. Most, if not all, of their work occurs behind the scenes, so I hope to take this opportunity to share my gratitude for their wisdom and generosity.

This summer, we completed work on a beautiful playset from Bears Playgrounds. The children absolutely love this addition, and I cannot help but dream up other improvements I would like to make to our outdoor space...in due time.

Finally, in collaboration with our sister organization Kaleidoscope Learning, we launched the Family Resource Center, which seeks to bridge the gap between home and school. Though Monarch fully handed over operations of the FRC to Kaleidoscope in the spring so that each organization can focus fully on their specific missions, we share staff, space, and a commitment to the families on the East Side. I cherish the opportunity to connect with parents and caregivers, and the FRC stands as a testament to both the inspiration and follow through of Monarch staff and volunteers.

After our third year, I feel proud that we:

- Renovated our outdoor playspace.
- Collaboratively launched the Family Resource Center, providing more opportunities for parent and community involvement.
- Hosted a Spring Musical Concert, highlighting the many home languages spoken by the children.
- o Again received a 4 Star Rating from Parent Aware, the highest possible rating.
- o Took our first field trip!
- o Continued to provide tuition assistance to eligible families.
- Retained a high percentage of families year-to-year.
- Sponsored See Her to become a trained Montessori guide.

In the coming years, I hope that we:

- Maintain more consistent enrollment throughout the year.
- o Grow our fundraising efforts to curb tuition costs.
- Expand our tuition assistance program.
- Install mulch surfacing for the entire outdoor playspace.
- Add elements to the outdoor playspace including a slide, expanded mud kitchen, and more permanent balancing apparatuses.
- o Connect with other early childhood and East Side organizations.

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



